CALL TO ORDER

COMMITTEE REPORTS

Chief Sampson, chair of the GACP committee advised of State Police Chiefs Day at the State Capitol the following Tuesday. She also stated that the Summer GACP conference in Savannah will be celebrating the 50th year of the GACP.

Chief Cooke, IACP representative, advised of a Bureau of justice Statistics survey that should be received by all soon with a focus on campus safety and crime prevention. He encouraged everyone to participate in the survey.

NEW BUSINESS

Chief Stapleton suggested that recently retired Chief Richard Goodson of Gwinnett College be recognized as an honorary lifetime member of the GACLEA for his many years of devotion and service to the association. It was unanimously approved, with the official recognition to occur at a later date.

A discussion ensued about the benefits of accessing the IACLEA website. Recent topics included the issue of extending the death benefits coverage to family members of police officers employed by private universities and colleges who are killed in the line of duty; Title IX issues; and the availability of grant funds.

The Spring meeting will be held in Americus, hosted by Chief Bryant, on May 24-25.
